

The undersigned is directed to inform that the Governments of Thailand has invited nominations for the above Fully Funded training course. The brochure and application form of the subject training course is available at www.ead.gov.pk.

2. The eligibility criteria and objectives of the subject course are as under:

Eligibility Criteria

- Be Permanent Government employee (BS-17 and above) nominated by the respective Federal Ministry or Provincial Department.
- Approximately two (2) years' work experience related to the use of basic knowledge in chemistry, biological or biomedical sciences or medicine.
- Hold a bachelor's degree in biological sciences, chemistry, pharmacy, or medicine from a university/technical college.
- Demonstrate proficiency in English (speaking, reading and writing).
- Be in good health, both physically and mentally, and have a health certificate provided by an authorized physician. This form is also attached together with the Application Form. Pregnancy is regarded as a disqualifying condition for participation in the course.

Objective

- To assist developing countries with human resource development in the fields of environmental health and toxicology, including the principles of toxicity testing.
- To understand the fundamental and basic concepts of toxicology, including mechanisms involved in chemical actions from the entrance of chemicals into the body until excretion (ADME); toxicokinetic; activation and detoxification mechanisms; dose-response relationships; types of harmful effects; biological and chemical factors that influence toxicity; and the principles for testing of the effects of various types of toxicants on human health, including novel testing methodology

Course Description:

The Chulabhorn Research Institute (CRI) is aware of the importance of providing a training program to assist developing countries with human resource development in the fields of environmental health and toxicology, including the principles of toxicity testing. In February 2026, CRI is organizing a training course on "Principles of Toxicology and Toxicity Testing" for participants from developing countries, primarily in the Asia/Pacific region.

This course presents the fundamental and basic concepts of toxicology, including mechanisms involved in chemical actions from the entrance of chemicals into the body until excretion (ADME); toxicokinetics; activation and detoxification mechanisms; dose-response relationships; types of harmful effects; biological and chemical factors that influence toxicity; and the principles for testing of the effects of various types of toxicants on human health, including novel testing methodology.

Participants who complete the courses will receive a Certificate of Completion for their professional portfolio.

Requirements:

Applicants must fulfill the following requirements:

- Approximately two (2) years' work experience related to the use of basic knowledge in chemistry, biological or biomedical sciences or medicine.
- Hold a bachelor's degree in biological sciences, chemistry, pharmacy, or medicine from a university/technical college.
- Demonstrate proficiency in English (speaking, reading and writing).
- Be in good health, both physically and mentally, and have a health certificate provided by an authorized physician. This form is also attached together with the Application Form. Pregnancy is regarded as a disqualifying condition for participation in the course.

Fellowship coverage:

The fellowship will cover course fees, round-trip airfare (direct, most economical route), accommodation allowance, daily stipend, training materials, and health insurance.
