Invitation to nominate candidates

The third WIPO/WTO Advanced Course on Intellectual Property for Government Officials from developing countries and countries with economies in transition is being jointly organized by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) and the World Trade Organization (WTO) in Geneva from 16 to 27 May 2011. The course is also open to a limited number of officials from developed countries at their own expense. The course seeks to be a multidisciplinary event, open to officials working in the field of Intellectual Property.

The main objective of the course is to update government officials in developing countries and countries with economies in transition on the activities and instruments of WIPO and the WTO, and to provide a forum for an exchange of information and ideas between them and the two Secretariats on these matters. The emphasis would be on recent developments and policy issues under debate in the two Organizations. This course is aimed at enhancing the capacity of governments in developing countries and in countries with economies in transition to develop national expertise in Intellectual Property. In particular, the following themes are intended to be covered in the course:

- An overview of international policy and law in intellectual property in developing countries in 2011
- Intellectual property in a trade law and developing countries setting
- Use of notifications and other documentation for policymakers
- Intellectual property and economic development
- WIPO Development Agenda
- Copyright overview: The current international landscape for the legal, policy and development dimension
- Provision on copyright and related rights in TRIPS: Dispute settlement
- Trademark and industrial design overview: The current international landscape for the legal, policy and development dimension

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- Geographical indications – Overview of the provisions in the TRIPS Agreement and current work in WIPO and WTO
- Implementation of Paragraph 6 of the Doha Declaration – Exports under a compulsory license
- Options under TRIPS for access to medicines: Current state of play of implementation
- Intellectual property, electronic commerce, internet domain names disputes and the WIPO arbitration and mediation centre
- Dispute settlement and TRIPS
- Intellectual property and genetic resources, traditional knowledge and folklore – Current international landscape and future directions
- International Convention for the Protection of new Varieties of Plants (UPOV)
- Biotechnology: Review of Article 27.3(b)
- Relationship between TRIPS and the Convention on Biological Diversity; Protection of Traditional Knowledge and Folklore: Current work in the WTO
- Transfer of Technology and Successful Technology Licensing (STL)
- Intellectual property law and public policy: The current research agenda
- Intellectual property and climate change
- Enforcement
- The nature of TRIPS dispute settlement: Non-violation and situation complaints and cross-sectoral remedies
- Technical assistance and capacity building in the area of intellectual property and responses at the international level

The working language will be English. Twenty (20) places are available for applicants from developing countries and countries with economies in transition. The costs related to their participation (a return economy class ticket, daily subsistence allowance, including lodging) will be borne by the organizers. An additional five places will be available for applicants from developed countries, at their own expense. A copy of the draft programme is attached (Attachment A).

Applicants must fulfil the following requirements:

- be a senior government official responsible for Intellectual Property policy issues in his/her country;
- possess an excellent knowledge of English.

Interested candidates should complete the attached Application Form (Attachment B).

Governments wishing to propose a candidate for this course should complete the attached Nomination Form (Attachment C). In order to qualify for this course, candidates must have completed the WTO on-line e-Training TRIPS course or possess commensurate knowledge or professional experience. The completed form should be legible and stamped with an official seal. Only forms submitted through the WTO contact point for your country/customs territory (usually Permanent Mission/Embassy) will be considered.
