HOW TO APPLY

1. APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY

KOICA-KAIST Scholarship Program applicants must satisfy all of the following requirements:

- (1) Bachelor's degree by August 31, 2013
 - GPA 3.3/4.3 preferred
 - Business, Natural Science and Computer Science majors (e.g. Economics, Mathematics, Statistics, Business, Engineering, etc.) with quantitative education/training preferred
- (2) Citizen of Korea not held.
- (3) Government Officials (Ministry of Finance and Central/State Bank)
 - Minimum of 3 years of experience preferred
- (4) Eng. Proficiency
 - Applicants must meet one of the English proficiency test minimum score requirements: TOEFL 550 (210 for computer-based; 80 for internet-based), IELTS 5.5, TEPS 550, TOEIC Listening & Reading 750 + Speaking level 6 + Writing level 7 or higher.
 - English proficiency tests conducted before April 23, 2011 will not be considered for admission. The test should be taken two years prior to the online application deadline.
 - ETS can send your score report directly to KAIST. The KAIST reporting code is 0195. Score reports must be received by the deadline.
 - Institutional Testing Program (ITP) is not valid.
 - Applicants whose native language (not official language) is English are exempt from submitting the EPT score.
 - If an applicant is not a native English speaker, he/she must submit the EPT score even if he/she attended an English speaking university.
 - EPT report submission can be waived only for those who apply from a country where EPT is not available. In this case, applicants are required to submit an

official letter from the minister or governor of one's affiliation guaranteeing one's Eng. proficiency equivalent to the required scores listed in 1).

This proposal will be the basis of the project paper that all KOICA-KAIST scholarship program students should complete and submit while taking 'Independent Study' course in 2015 spring semester.

5. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Fill out the 'Application Forms' and check whether all information is correct.

Prepare all required documents for your admission package and fill out the 'Document Checklist'.

Include the 'Document Checklist' in your admission package and submit the package to the regional KOICA office or relevant government office.

Participate in 1st round on-site interview by Korean Embassy or KOICA office and those who pass through the interview must apply online. (2nd round is processed with only those who successfully pass through KAIST's document screening.)

Check out your admission result.

6. SELECTION PROCESS

1st Round Selection Process

On-site Interview by Korean Embassy or KOICA Office

April 5 (Mon.) ~April 16 (Tue.)

The Korean embassy or KOICA office will conduct an interview for each applicant. If an applicant lives in a country where the Embassy/KOICA office does not exist or lives far from the capital city, he/she may be exempted from the interview in the 1st round in consultation with the Embassy/KOICA office.

Online Application: April 17 (Wed.) to April 23 (Tue.)

Applicants who pass the on-site interview must apply online though http://apply.kaist.ac.kr. The applications will be activated from April 1 to April 23. Please read instructions carefully before you begin your application.

Application Fee: 80,000 KRW or 80 USD (Fee should be paid by the deadline)

* The application fee will be reimbursed to those who are successfully admitted after your arrival to Korea.

Document Screening: April 24 (Wed.) to May 14 (Tue.)

Application package- KAIST application form, KOICA application form, all required documents- as well as the on-site interview result will be thoroughly reviewed by Finance MBA Admission Committee of KAIST College of Business. Every component included in the application package such as the reputation of undergraduate school, undergraduate GPA, English proficiency, current affiliation, working experience will be evenly evaluated.

2nd Round Selection Process

Phone Interview: May 15 (Wed.) to May 29 (Wed.)

Phone interviews will be conducted for only those who successfully pass through the document screening. Phone interview schedule will be notified individually by the regional KOCIA offices or relevant government offices with 2~3 day notice in advance.

Selection Result: June 28 (Fri.)
